# Successful Funding Highlight

Recipient: Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection

Projects: Superfund Cleanup in Lower and Upper Salford Townships

Agency: Environmental Protection Agency

**Description:** At the end of February, the Biden-Harris Administration announced a third and final wave of more than \$1 billion for cleanup projects at 25 superfund sites. These funds - made possible by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law - will help to remediate contamination at superfund sites nationwide. Two of the projects are right here in PA-04 (learn more about these projects in Lower Salford Township and Upper Salford Township).

# In Case You Missed It!

#### **Community Project Funding**

The House Committee on Appropriations has yet to announce guidance for Community Project Funding for fiscal year 2025.

When the Appropriations Subcommittees do go public with their program guidelines, we expect that the window between the initial date of guidelines being released and the final date for submissions will be short. For that reason, we are taking the step this year to allow prospective

applicants to share information with our office ahead of the formal opening of the program to help to mitigate the challenges of the tight turnaround time.

## **U.S. Department of Agriculture**

Farmers Market Promotion Program

Agency: <u>Agriculture</u> > <u>Agricultural Marketing Service</u>

**Description:** The Farmers Market Promotion Program funds projects that develop, coordinate and expand direct producer-to-consumer markets to help increase access to and availability of locally and regionally produced agricultural products by developing, coordinating, expanding, and providing outreach, training, and technical assistance to domestic farmers markets, roadside stands, community-supported agriculture programs, agritourism activities, online sales or other direct producer-to-consumer (including direct producer-to-retail, direct producer-torestaurant and direct producer-to-institutional marketing) market opportunities.

Closing Date: May 14, 2024

Local Food Promotion Program

Agency: <u>Agriculture</u> > <u>Agricultural Marketing Service</u>

**Description:** The Local Food Promotion Program funds projects that develop, coordinate, and expand local and regional food business enterprises that engage as intermediaries in indirect

producer to consumer marketing to help increase access to and availability of locally and regionally produced agricultural products.

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#### **Regional Food System Partnerships Program**

Agency: <u>Agriculture</u> > <u>Agricultural Marketing Service</u>

**Description:** The Regional Food System Partnerships program supports partnerships that connect public and private resources to plan and develop local or regional food systems. The program focuses on building and strengthening the viability and resilience of local or regional food economies through collaboration and coordination. RFSP supports public-private partnerships that plan and develop relationships between local and regional producers, processors, intermediaries, and institutional markets or institutional food service operations through local and regional producers and local and regional food systems.

#### Distance Learning & Telemedicine Grants

#### Agency: <u>Agriculture</u> > <u>Rural Development</u>

**Description:** This program helps rural communities use advanced telecommunications technology to connect to each other - and the world - overcoming the effects of remoteness and low population density. Projects should promote equity and economic opportunity in rural America, specifically those that advance these key priorities:

- 1. Assisting rural communities economically through more and better market opportunities and through improved infrastructure;
- 2. Ensuring all rural residents have equitable access to Rural Development programs and benefits from Rural Development funded projects; and
- 3. Reducing climate pollution and increasing resilience to the impacts of climate change through economic support to rural communities.

# **U.S. Department of Justice**

<u>Grants to Engage Men and Boys as Allies in the Prevention of Violence Against Women and</u> <u>Girls</u>

Agency: <u>Justice</u> > <u>Office on Violence Against Women</u>

**Description:** This program seeks to implement education, training, or other programming that enables men and boys to serve as allies in the prevention of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, and sex trafficking.

<u>Grants to Prevent and Respond to Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault,</u> <u>Stalking, and Sex Trafficking Against Children and Youth Program</u>

Agency: Justice > Office on Violence Against Women

**Description:** This program supports comprehensive, community-based efforts to develop or expand prevention, intervention, treatment, and response strategies to address the needs of children and youth impacted by domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, and sex trafficking.

Law Enforcement Mental Health and Wellness Act (LEMHWA) Program

Agency: Justice > Community Oriented Policing Services

**Description:** The Law Enforcement Mental Health and Wellness Act (LEMHWA) Program funds are used to improve the delivery of and access to mental health and wellness services for law enforcement through the implementation of peer support, training, family resources, suicide prevention, and other promising practices for wellness programs. The LEMHWA program funds

projects that develop knowledge, increase awareness of effective mental health and wellness strategies, increase the skills and abilities of law enforcement, and increase the number of law enforcement agencies and relevant stakeholders using peer support, training, family resources, suicide prevention, and other promising practices for wellness programs.

### **U.S. Department of Health & Human Services**

**Building Communities of Recovery** 

Agency: <u>HHS</u> > <u>SAMHSA</u>

**Description:** The purpose of this program is to mobilize and connect a broad array of community-based resources to increase the availability and quality of long-term recovery support for persons with substance use disorders and co-occurring substance use and mental disorders. Recipients will be expected to support the development, enhancement, expansion, and delivery of recovery support services directly to individuals as well as advance the promotion of, and education about, recovery at a community level.

Sober Truth on Preventing Underage Drinking Act Grants

Agency: <u>HHS</u> > <u>SAMHSA</u>

**Description:** The purpose of this program is to prevent and reduce alcohol use among youth and young adults ages 12 to 20 in communities throughout the United States. Award recipients will be expected to implement activities that support capacity building such as implementing evidence-based community approaches, enhancing collaboration, cooperation and coordination among communities, federal, state, and local and tribal governments, and convening town halls.

Educational Technology, Media, and Materials for Individuals with Disabilities Program

Agency: Education > Office of Special Education Programs

**Description:** The purpose of the Educational Technology, Media, and Materials for Individuals with Disabilities Program is to improve results for children with disabilities by:

- 1. Promoting the development, demonstration, and use of technology;
- 2. Supporting educational activities designed to be of educational value in the classroom for children with disabilities;
- 3. Providing support for captioning and video description that is appropriate for use in the classroom; and

**Description:** The Mental Health Service Professional Demonstration Grant Program provides competitive grants to support and demonstrate innovative partnerships to train school-based mental health service providers for employment in schools and local educational agencies (LEAs). # **U.S. Department of Homeland Security**

Staffing For Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Grants

Agency: <u>Homeland Security</u> > <u>FEMA</u>

**Description:** The Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response Grants was created to provide funding directly to fire departments and volunteer firefighter interest organizations to help them increase or maintain the number of trained, "front line" firefighters available in their communities. The goal of SAFER is to enhance the local fire departments' abilities to comply with staffing, response and operational standards established by the National Fire Protection Association.

# **U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs**

Veterans Legacy Program

Agency: Veterans Affairs > National Cemetery Administration

**Description:** The Veterans Legacy Program (VLP) commemorates our nation's Veterans and Service Members through the discovery and sharing of their stories. VLP encourages students and teachers around the country at the University and K-12 levels to immerse themselves in the rich historical resources found within VA's National Cemeteries and VA Grant funded cemeteries.

NCA established the Veterans Legacy Program (VLP) on Memorial Day 2016 to fulfill its mission to memorialize Veterans in perpetuity, and to do that in innovative and engaging ways. Many Americans are unaware that NCA operates 155 national cemeteries, with more being added regularly. These cemeteries are spread throughout the country, in major cities and small towns. Each uniquely reflects the community where it resides.

**Carbon Utilization Procurement Grants** 

Agency: Energy

**Description:** The overall objective of this program is to support DOE's current vision of the Carbon Utilization Procurement Grants Program which will illustrate that several incumbent products can be replaced or supplemented with alternatives that are derived from the conversion of anthropogenic carbon oxides, demonstrating that significant net reductions in greenhouse gas emissions are possible. These grants will illustrate that more sustainable alternatives are viable and will promote the deployment of these products even after the grant ends.

# **National Science Foundation**

**Civic Innovation Challenge** 

Agency: National Science Foundation

**Description:** The Civic Innovation Challenge (CIVIC) is a research and action competition that accelerates the transition to practice of foundational research and emerging technologies into

communities through civic-engaged research. By addressing priorities at the local scale that are relevant across the US, CIVIC is laying the foundation for a broader and more fluid exchange of research and technology capabilities and civic priorities through joint partnerships involving civic partners and the research community. CIVIC funds projects that pilot state-of-the-art solutions to community challenges over 12 months, following a six-month planning phase, and have the potential for lasting impact in the partnering community as well as the potential to be scaled and implemented in other communities. Additionally, the foundation for CIVIC projects should be rooted in maturing and transitioning state-of-the-art research in disciplines, including but not limited to computer science, engineering, geosciences, biological sciences, and social sciences.
